WHAT

Arts+ seeks to honor musical excellence as central to our mission, as well as to ensure financial accessibility for our families. We are offering nine merit-based scholarships for the 2019-2020 school year.

WHO

Any Arts+ student between age 6 and 18 is invited to audition.

HOW

1. Discuss preparedness with instructor.
2. Complete application.

5. Bring 3 unmarked copies of the sheet music to the audition.

Expectations of Scholarship Recipients

- Upon being chosen for a Merit Scholarship, recipients and their parent(s)/guardian(s) will each sign the Expectation Agreement for Arts+ Merit Scholars. This agreement outlines the following points:
 - Scholars are expected to take lessons with Arts+ both the fall and spring semesters. Scholarships do not go toward the summer session.
 - Scholars are expected to perform in the 2020 Merit Recital in February 2020.
 - Scholars will provide a headshot and a short 3-4 sentence biography to Arts+ to be used in the Merit Recital printed program and materials, as well as for various performance events.
 - Scholars will write a thank you letter in January 2020 to their specific scholarship donor, thanking them for the opportunity provided by their award. Arts+ will communicate with families with specific details around this.
 - Scholars will occasionally be asked to represent Arts+ for scholarship donors, the Board of Directors, fundraising events, or various community events.
- Arts+ will recognize recipients in the following ways:
 - Scholars will be honored in recital programs by denoting the scholarship they hold.
 - Arts+ newsletters and social media posts will profile scholarship winners over the spring and summer in 2019.
 - Scholar biographies and headshots will be provided in the Merit Recital printed program and at various performance events as the event allows.
 - Arts+ will provide certificates to scholars and will assist in providing further documentation as needed for admissions to colleges and other programs when communicated well in advance.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

Students will be automatically disqualified if they are late to their audition time.

Students will be introduced to the adjudicators by an Arts+ staff member. Students **may not** speak to the adjudicators.

Adjudicators are independent, highly-qualified musicians and pedagogues. They are not members of the Arts+ Music Faculty.

Students will be stopped if they exceed the 5 minute limit.

If you need an accompanist

Students needing an accompanist must follow these steps:

1. Email a PDF scan of the accompaniment to Wes Smith, Director of Music Programs, no later than **Fri. February 22nd**. Please make any notations about cuts or changes to the music very clear, noticeable, and legible.
 - PDF scans received after Feb. 22nd will not be considered, even if all other materials are complete. If this were to happen, the student will still be allowed to audition but must do so unaccompanied.

2. Soon after materials are received, the Music Programs Coordinator will contact parents to schedule one 20-minute rehearsal with the accompanist for the week of the audition.

The earlier that you submit accompaniment, the sooner it will be given to the accompanist to begin practicing and scheduling rehearsals.

Instructor Approval

In lieu of requiring a Letter of Recommendation from the instructor as in years past:

- Students, Parents/Guardians, and Instructors should have a conversation **prior** to applying to discuss if the student is ready for consideration of being a Merit Scholar.
- Instructors will be contacted by the Director of Music Programs after the application due date to **confirm** their students who have applied. If there is a student on the list that the instructor had not had a conversation with prior, the instructor may choose whether or not to approve that student for auditioning this year.
