ABOUT ARTS+:

Arts+'s mission is *unleashing creativity, transforming lives and building community through outstanding and accessible arts education*. Arts+ serves 4,500 students annually through music and visual arts programs, including private lessons, group classes, summer camps, workshops and the Charlotte Youth Choir. Thanks to outreach programs and financial aid, more than half of students receive their programming for free or at a reduced rate.

OVERVIEW:

Our Summer Camps are one-week instance of day camps, primarily for students in Kindergarten to 5th Grade, with some additional camps that fall outside that range. Our flagship camp is our "Discovering Music + Art Camp" which provides exciting exploratory experiences in art and music, focusing on general music and art curriculum but in a fun and engaging way. Our camp faculty are responsible for planning lesson plans and activities for music classes for campers, with support and strategy from our Music Programs Staff.

Camp types include (weeks vary throughout the summer, see website for full roster of camps):

- Discovering Music + Art Camp (K – 5th grade)
- Discovering Strings + Art Camp (K – 5th grade)
- Charlotte Youth Choir Camp (2nd – 6th grade)
- Band and Orchestra Camp (K – 12th grade orchestra; 5th – 12th grade band)
- Exploring Ukulele Camp (3rd – 6th grade)

CONTRACT DURATION:

Contract for a full camp, which runs one week each. Contract can include multiple weeks, as it fits with schedules and Arts+'s faculty needs. Contract could also be for a singular week if desired and if it fits Arts+'s faculty needs.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Create lesson plans, activities, and prep materials for summer camp music classes, with support and strategy from the Music Programs Staff.
- Collaborate with the camp faculty to create high-quality lesson plans and curricular goals while also focusing on fostering an engaging and meaningful camp experience for students.
- Coordinate with camp faculty, collegiate interns, and high school counselors to complete camp functions such as recess, lunchtime, snacktime, games, drop-off and pick-up.
- Manage instruction in a classroom environment, including managing student behavior.
- Perform general faculty responsibilities according to the guidelines listed in the Faculty Handbook, including completing attendance, time sheets, and maintaining excellent customer service for students and parents.
- Attend pre-summer camp faculty planning meeting.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Minimum Qualifications:
 - Bachelor's Degree in Music / Music Education, or comparable experience
 - 3+ years of teaching experience
- Knowledge and understanding of varied teaching methodologies and the ability to differentiate instruction to meet the diverse needs of students of all ages, backgrounds, and ability levels.
- Dedication to working in a collaborative environment in a reputable community arts school.
