


# Welcome to ARTS+

Dear Students and Families,

Welcome to Arts+, formerly Community School of the Arts. We are very excited to have you join the 50-year legacy of Arts+. Fifty years ago in the basement of First Presbyterian Church, founder Henry Bridges was surrounded by an urban neighborhood with children who could benefit from --- but could never afford --- high-quality music lessons.

Henry recruited four of the finest piano teachers in Charlotte as his faculty, and from more than 150 student applications, he accepted twenty children into the inaugural year. The quality of the instruction was exceptional, and Arts+ rapidly expanded to offer tuition-based programs for families who could pay for lessons, in addition to the School's free and discounted outreach programs.

From our small beginning serving the neighborhoods around First Presbyterian Church, we have grown to reach more than 4,500 students each year in community locations across Charlotte.

The founding mission remains our mission today – Unleashing creativity, transforming lives and building community through outstanding and accessible arts education.

We are confident that the arts will teach you new skills and new perspectives, and that you will be enriched by your time at Arts+.

I look forward to keeping you informed as we continue to celebrate 50 years of arts education.

# About ARTS+

## HISTORY

Henry Bridges founded Arts+, formerly Community School of the Arts, in 1969, when he served as the organist and choir director of First Presbyterian Church in downtown Charlotte. The program was born after Henry realized that the Church had fifteen unused pianos in its basement and that it was surrounded by an urban neighborhood with children who could benefit from high-quality music lessons.

From more than 150 student applications, Henry accepted twenty children into the inaugural year. Students received instruction free of charge five days a week, including two piano lessons, supervised practice, choir, sight singing and music theory. Arts+ rapidly expanded to offer tuition-based programs for families who could pay for lessons, in addition to Arts+'s free and discounted outreach programs.

Henry Bridges remained the executive director of Arts+ until 1982, when he stepped away from administrative duties and became a full time piano teacher in the Piedmont Courts Public Housing Project. In 1998, Arts+, which had long been an independent non-profit housed at First Presbyterian Church, moved to new offices and studios at Spirit Square, providing a high profile downtown location for programs. From twenty students in 1969, Arts+ has grown to serve more than 4,500 a year and has grown to employ over 50 dedicated instructors.

Through Arts+'s five decades, its programs have changed and expanded based on community demand, at times including dance, theatre and extensive school-based classes. Arts+ now concentrates on instruction in **music** and the **visual arts**, offering private and group music lessons, visual art classes and workshops, summer camps, the Charlotte Children's Choir, and early childhood art and music education. And, as it has every year since its founding, Arts+ teaches extensively in low-income neighborhoods and provides significant student financial assistance, honoring its founding mission and the belief that outstanding arts education should be available to all.

# Private Instruction

## BENEFITS OF PRIVATE MUSIC LESSONS

## RECITAL INFORMATION

Student recitals at Arts+ play an important role in the musical training and development of young musicians. Recitals give students an opportunity to display their talents and achievements with family, friends, teachers, and fellow students. Arts+ believes that high quality recitals will add to students' learning experiences, developing poise and self-assurance.

### ASSISTING YOUR CHILD:

Even if children have had frequent recital experiences, but especially if they have not, parents can greatly assist by doing recital **"practice runs"** at home. Setting the stage, trying out recital pieces for family and neighbors, practicing walking, bowing, etc. – all will enhance the student's comfort and ensure his/her preparedness. Whether performances go perfectly or not, the greatest contribution a parent can make is in positive support, encouraging words, pats on the back, and instilling pride for a job well done.

## MERIT SCHOLARSHIP AUDITIONS

Arts+ offers a variety of scholarships for outstanding students in our private lesson division. Arts+ awards scholarships based on merit and awards that are determined by external and independent professional arts educators, frequently faculty at local university art programs. Scholarships are awarded to young children through high school students, based on the recommendations of the adjudicators.

- Auditions are held each spring for the following school year. The 2019 audition date is **March 14, 2020**.

# GROUP CLASSES + WORKSHOPS

## EARLY CHILDHOOD

### • **Discovering Suzuki 4-6 years** (with an adult)

Explore character development and visual narrative; Build observational drawing skills in figurative expression and spatial perspective.

### • **Ukulele for Teens at The Plaza 12-17 years**

Perfect introduction for teens interested in learning this fun instrument! Learn to play several chords, as well as basic strumming patterns and how to read tableture.

### • **Guitar for Teens at The Plaza 10-17 years**

Aspiring guitarists will learn multiple chords, strumming patterns and reading guitar tabs.

### • **Teen Art Studio at Spirit Square 13-18 years**

Explore interest in visual art by learning alongside a working professional artist and engage in self-guided portfolio projects and sketchbook exercises

### • **Chamber Ensemble 11-18 years**

This group will focus on musicianship, performing in an ensemble without a conductor, building musical independence and teamwork, developing problem-solving skills and learning repertoire for string chamber ensembles. 1-3 community performance events.

# ADULT

- **Adult Beginning Guitar**

Learn to play a few starter chords through this fun introductory course. The workshop is free for adults 21+ only and is BYOB-friendly.

- **Adult Beginning Ukulele**

Learn to play a few starter chords through this fun introductory course. By the end of the workshop, you'll be able to play along to a few songs on your own! The workshop is free for adults 21+ only and is BYOB-friendly.

- **Open Life Drawing Sessions**

Offer a chance to draw from the live model in a community of artists and students. These non-instructional sessions provide two hours with a live model each week.

## FAMILY WORKSHOPS

### **Musical Saturdays, Ages 3-8 & Caregivers**

Join us one Saturday a month for a musical exploration through songs, movement and instruments! Each workshop will have a different theme, so please feel free to come dressed to impress! More information for dates and times on our website!

# V. REGISTRATION POLICIES

## REGISTRATION FEE

- \$25 per student/per semester fee
- Private lessons/Charlotte Children's Choir: one-time \$35 payment when registering for entire year (fall/spring semesters)
- Family rate: fee waived for families with 3+ students
- Registration fee is non-refundable

## LATE FEE

- \$25 late fee for payments made past first lesson/class

## PAYMENT POLICY

Tuition is due at time of registration

- All payments must be made no later than 24 hours prior to first lesson/class

Payments made by: credit card, check or money order

- Visa, MasterCard and American Express
- All payments run through a secure server

Private Music Lessons: automated credit card payment plan offered for balances of more than \$200.00

- Initial deposit of 50% at time of registration
- 3 additional equal installments scheduled (*for credit card users only*)

## FINANCIAL AID

- Provided based on availability of funds
- Deadline is April 22, 2020 for 2020/2021 semesters

*Arts+ makes its financial aid awards based on availability of funds and on a sliding scale similar to the one public schools use to determine eligibility for free/reduced school lunches*

## REFUNDS

Private Lessons

- Partial refund available if student withdraws before the **third lesson**
- Arts+ is unable to issue refunds after third lesson

Group Classes

- Refunds only available if request is submitted one week before the first class
- Arts+ is unable to issue refunds once group class has begun

## MISSED LESSONS

- Students are expected to attend all lessons
- No make-up policy
  - If a student misses a lesson or class, Arts+ will not issue a refund, and instructors are not required to teach make-up sessions
- Teacher illness/emergency
  - Teacher will schedule a make-up lesson at no additional cost to the student
- Grace Period: Instructors and students are asked to observe a 10-minute grace period before labeling the lesson a "no show" and leaving the premises.

# PARENT AGREEMENT

## MISSED LESSONS

Students are expected to attend all lessons. **Arts+ has a no make-up policy: If a student misses a lesson or class, Arts+ will not issue a refund, and instructors are not required to teach make-up lessons.** However, if a class or lesson is cancelled due to weather, instructor illness, or instructor emergency, the instructor will schedule a make-up lesson at no additional cost.

## PAYMENTS AND REFUNDS

Payment for lessons is due prior to the first lesson of each semester. Failure to pay the full balance or set up a payment plan prior to the first lesson could result in the termination of lessons. Scheduled times will not be reserved for unpaid students. A partial refund is available only for private lessons if the student gives a notice to withdraw before the third lesson. After the third lesson, no refunds will be given.

## WEATHER CANCELLATION

Arts+ generally follows the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools closing policy for inclement weather, however exceptions do occur based on our community partner locations and weather conditions in the evening, when most of our programs take place. In the event of bad weather or a CMS closing, parents should always check for closing information on Arts+'s website at [www.artsplus.org](http://www.artsplus.org), Arts+'s Facebook page at [www.facebook.com/artsplus.clt](http://www.facebook.com/artsplus.clt), or Arts+'s main phone line, at 704.377.4187. Any information on Arts+ closings will be posted there by 11:00 a.m. Under no circumstances should parents or students travel in dangerous conditions to reach a lesson.

## INSTRUMENTS, MUSIC AND MATERIALS REQUIRED FOR LESSONS

Students are expected to bring their instruments (except piano, voice and drums) and all required materials to every lesson that is requested by the instructor. Instructors are not expected to provide any materials that the student did not bring for the lesson that day.

## EXPECTATIONS OF PARENTS OF PRIVATE MUSIC STUDENTS

Arts+ asks all families to show respect for our instructors by arriving on time for lessons and fostering a professional atmosphere that is conducive to learning. Please be sure there are no disruptions to the lesson from siblings, cell phones, or guests. No pets are allowed at Arts+ facilities.

\*Suzuki parents/caregivers are expected to attend and participate in lessons as requested by their instructors.

Turn right and walk down short hallway. Take either the elevator on left or stairs on right to the Upper floor and you'll find Arts+'s classrooms there.*

Arts+ is proud to announce a new pilot creative arts lab, The Bridge, located near the NoDa neighborhood. This 18month project aims to serve as a platform for testing new approaches to arts education and activating a neighborhood that lacks arts education experiences. With this purpose in mind, The Bridge is not located in a well-known area; it is off the beaten path. Note that some GPS directions are incorrect, so please pay careful attention to the instructions below. Also, the intersection of Craighead Road and the LYNX light rail has recently closed. There is no access to Craighead Road from North Davidson Street

# VIII. LOCATION INFORMATION

## +NoDa

### THE BRIDGE

4100 Raleigh Street, Charlotte, NC 28213

#### **LYNX Blue Line**

The Sugar Creek light rail station is located immediately next to the building in which The Bridge is located. When exiting the light rail at the Sugar Creek station, walk across the adjacent concrete parking lot to your right, towards the garage doors. Follow the sidewalk to the left of the garage doors, on the street-side of the building. Take the sidewalk all the way to the Sugar Creek Road bridge, turn right, and the entrance to our space will be at the end of the sidewalk.

#### **Arriving from North Tryon Street**

For those arriving from N Tryon Street, travelling north, take a right on E Craighead Road, which is about 3 miles from Uptown. In less than ½ mile, take a left onto Raleigh Street. In a short distance, Raleigh Street will appear to dead end, when in fact, it continues to the right. Take that right to stay on Raleigh Street. After taking this right, The Bridge will be on your right in less than ½ mile, immediately after the LYNX parking garage. Park in the concrete lot adjacent to the road and follow the sidewalk to the left of the garage doors, on the street-side of the building. Take the sidewalk all the way to the Sugar Creek Road bridge, turn right, and the entrance to our space will be at the end of the sidewalk.


#### **Arriving from North Davidson Street**

The LYNX light rail intersection at Craighead Road is now permanently closed. There is no access to Craighead Road from North Davidson Street. For guests arriving from N Davidson Street, travelling north, take a left on Sugar Creek Road (just past Craighead Road) and continue following the directions below for arriving from East Sugar Creek Road.

#### **Arriving from East Sugar Creek Road**

For guests arriving from E Sugar Creek Road, travelling north along the bridge, take a left onto Greensboro Road at the bottom of the bridge. This road will become Raleigh Street in a short distance, and The Bridge will be on your right in ½ mile, immediately after the LYNX parking garage. Park in the concrete lot adjacent to the road and follow the sidewalk to the left of the garage doors, on the street-side of the building. Take the sidewalk all the way to the Sugar Creek Road bridge, turn right, and the entrance to our space will be at the end of the sidewalk.

**Important Note:** Some GPS systems will guide you onto E Sugar Creek Road to access Raleigh Street. This is not possible. Raleigh Street cannot be accessed from the E Sugar Creek Road Bridge. Raleigh Street can only be accessed from N Tryon Street, N Davidson Street and Greensboro Road.

## PROGRAMS

### Private Lessons

Arts+'s first program was private instruction, which remains its best-known program, with approximately 350 students enrolled in music private lessons each semester. Weekly instruction is available on 17 instruments in traditional, Suzuki, and rock/blues methods. Arts+ is now offering ukulele lessons as well as adaptive lessons for students with special needs.

### Group Music and Visual Art Classes

Arts+ offers a wide range of group music and visual art classes for children ages 2 and up as well as adults. Classes include Suzuki programs, Chamber Strings, Ukulele and Guitar, Art Exploration, Beginning Animation, Comic Book Drawing, City Sketchbooks for Teens, Adult Painting and much more!

### Charlotte Children's Choir

In January of 2015, Arts+ acquired the Charlotte Children's Choir, integrating quality choral music into the School's programming. CCC is made up of four choirs: Harmony Choir – a training choir, Lyric Choir – an intermediary choir, Cantare Choir – a choir for young men and Concert Choir – an advanced choir.

### Music Around and Preschool Art Lab

In addition to its out-of-school programs, Arts+ also works with area schools to provide supplementary in-school arts programming. Through Music Around, preschools, private schools, and charter schools contract with Arts+ to have Arts+ faculty lead weekly music classes at those schools.

Through the Preschool Arts Lab (PAL), area schools bring their students to the Spirit Square art studio once a month for a hands-on, literacy-based arts lab. Students are read a book and then participate in a number of art activities based on the book's content. Arts+ offers PAL 'On the Go,' which takes the Preschool Arts Lab out of Arts+'s art studio and into local schools.

Arts+ also brings Music Around, PAL, and other early childhood arts education programs into schools serving at-risk populations, securing outside funding so that the schools receive their programming free of charge.

## **Summer Camps and Workshops**

Each summer, Arts+ offers more than 15 week-long visual art and music camps and workshops, including: Band Camp: Concert and Jazz, String Orchestra Camp, Suzuki Violin Camps, Preschool, Kids, and Youth Arts Camps, a Comic Book Drawing Workshop, and Teen Art Workshops.

## **ArtsReach**

ArtsReach is one of Arts+'s oldest outreach programs, through which Arts+ offers music and visual art after-school programs to at-risk children at local community centers, shelters, Title I schools, and centers for behavioral healthcare.

## **Project Harmony**

Arts+ is excited to join the Charlotte Symphony in a partnership to provide free orchestra programs to underserved communities around Charlotte, which began in the fall of 2017. Project Harmony is inspired by the renowned El Sistema youth and community development program of Venezuela and is now at four locations across Charlotte.

## **Financial Aid and Scholarships**

For private lessons, group classes, summer camps, and the Charlotte Children's Choir, the School offers need-based financial aid to more than 100 students annually. For approximately a dozen exceptionally talented students each year, Arts+ also offers audition- and portfolio-based merit scholarships.

## **Culture Blocks**

Through the Arts & Science Council's Culture Blocks program, Arts+ brings free community workshops in both visual art and music to libraries and recreation centers in Mecklenburg County's "cultural deserts."

## **School Ready with Art**

School Ready with Art is an outreach program designed to integrate the arts into core curriculum subjects at preschools serving low-income populations. Through School Ready with Art, Arts+ faculty bring arts-integrated lessons into preschool classrooms at participating schools.
