WHAT

Central to our mission, Arts+ seeks to honor musical excellence and ensure financial accessibility for all families by offering merit-based scholarships for the subsequent school year.

WHO

Any Arts+ student between age 6 and 18 is invited to audition.

HOW

Students are selected via audition on Saturday, March 7, 2026.

Students should prepare an audition piece or excerpt of no more than 5 minutes in length.

The application process is described on the following page in detail.

There is no fee to audition.

WHEN

Application materials received via emailed no later than:

Mon. February 9, 12:00pm Noon

(Late or incomplete applications will not be considered.)

Steps to Applying

Please follow the below steps for applying to audition:

1. Discuss readiness with instructor.
2. Select one piece or excerpt of **no more than 5 minutes** for the audition.
3. Fill out the application on the final page of this information packet.
4. **Prepare an unmarked copy of the sheet music of your audition piece.**
 - **If you need an accompanist, submit the piano score which has the accompaniment part and the solo instrument/vocal part on the same page.** This copy will be used by the judges as well as the accompanist.
 - Arts+ will copy and provide this for the judges on the day of the audition on your behalf.
 - The only acceptable marks in the music would be to notate cuts, if necessary.
 - A selection with accompaniment is **not** required to audition. Unaccompanied is fine.
5. Send the (1) application and (2) copy of the sheet music to the Director of Music Programs.

If You Need an Accompanist

Students needing an accompanist must follow these steps:

1. When you submit your application, submit the piano score instead of the solo part. Please make any notations about cuts or changes to the music very clear, noticeable, and legible.
 - **Sheet Music received after the application due date will not be accepted.** The student can still audition but must do so without accompaniment.

2. The Music Programs team will contact parents to schedule one 20-minute rehearsal with the accompanist for the week of the audition. Only one 20-minute rehearsal is provided, so please take that into consideration with repertoire selection.

Adjudication Criteria

Students will be judged on the following eight categories:

Technique	Pitch Accuracy
Musicality	Rhythmic Accuracy
Tone Quality	Tempo
Dynamics	Articulation (instrumentalists) / Diction (vocalists)

Additional Audition Notes

- Students will be automatically disqualified if they are late to their audition time. Please plan plenty of time for parking and finding the venue.
- Students will be introduced to the adjudicators by an Arts+ staff member. Students may **not** speak to the adjudicators.
- Students will be stopped if they exceed the 5 minute limit.
- Adjudicators are independent, highly-qualified musicians and pedagogues. They are not members of the Arts+ Music Faculty.

Instructor Approval

- Students, Parents/Guardians, and Instructors **must** have a conversation **prior** to applying to discuss if the student is prepared to audition and represent Arts+ as a Merit Scholar.
- Instructors will be contacted by the Director of Music Programs to confirm approved students.

Expectations of Scholarship Recipients

- If selected for a Merit Scholarship, recipients and their parent(s)/guardian(s) will sign the Expectation Agreement for Arts+ Merit Scholars. This agreement outlines the following points:
 - Scholars are expected to take lessons with Arts+ both the fall and spring semesters. Scholarships do not go toward the summer session.
 - Scholars are expected to perform in the Merit and Senior Recital in of their award year.
 - Scholars will provide a headshot and a short 3-4 sentence biography to Arts+ to be used in the Merit Recital printed program and materials, as well as for various performance events.
 - Scholars will write a thank you letter in January to their specific scholarship donor, thanking them for the opportunity provided by their award. Arts+ will communicate specific details with families.
 - Scholars may occasionally be asked to represent Arts+ for scholarship donors, the Board of Directors, fundraising events, or various community events.

- Arts+ will recognize recipients in the following ways:
 - Scholars will be honored in recital programs by denoting the scholarship they hold.
 - Arts+ newsletters and social media posts will profile scholarship winners during the school year.
 - Scholar biographies and headshots will be provided in the Merit Recital printed program and at various performance events as the event allows.
 - Arts+ will provide certificates to scholars and can assist in providing further documentation as needed for admissions to colleges and other programs when communicated well in advance.
